If your household water comes from a private well, it is not tested by any state or local authority. Well water tests can be expensive, but Union residents may have their drinking water tested for coliform bacteria and nitrates for \$60. Additional testing options are available.

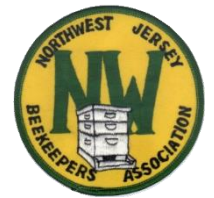
Mara Tippet, RHA Well Testing Program Manager, will be on site to answer any questions about well water testing. More information is available at www.testmywell.org
